#### Leonard's Department Store Museum

This year we had our Chapter Christmas Dinner at the M&O Grill in Fort Worth. The grill commemorates the former Leonard's Department store and the store's private subway, the M&O Subway which took customers from the parking lot to the store complex. After Leonard's closed, the Tandy Corporation (Radio Shack) ran the subway with different cars finally closing it in 2002. At the restaurant is a museum honoring Leonard's and the M&O Subway. This brochure on the M&O Subway and the restoration of one of its cars came from the Leonard's Museum.



#### **Leonard's Department Store**

"Leonard's was a "one-stop shopping center" years before there were shopping centers. You could buy vegetable seeds to plant in your garden or purchase Emily Post's Etiquette. It was a department store with the latest in affordable fashions as well as a complete farm store, a grocery store, a hardware store, a beauty salon and an automotive supply. It was a furniture store, a sporting goods store and at Christmas there was Toyland, the most spectacular toy store in town."

#### **M&O Subway**

"When the crowds at Leonard's became so large that it created a parking problem downtown; **LEONARD'S** *Department Store* built and operated the world's only privately owned subway, the "M&O". Leonard's was a cross between a modern day super store and a shopping mall. A place to purchase merchandise and to meet up with friends. Going to Leonard's on Saturday was an 'event' that the whole family looked forward to doing together whether they traveled to the store from across town or from halfway across Texas.

Museum visitors can view displays featuring hundreds of items from the store as well as learn about the unique history of a Fort Worth icon. The **LEONARD'S** *Department Store Museum* is located in the Fort Worth Screen Printing building on the corner of Carroll and Whitmore, one block south of White Settlement Road."






#### Texas Electric Railway, Illustrated

#### **NRHS** Update

#### NRHS Dues Collection & Reporting for 2015

In the December 2014 issue of the *Telegraph*, the NRHS updates members on dues collection, processing and reporting for 2015. Below is a <u>summary</u> of the original articles. This is intended as a <u>convenience</u> to inform members who read the print edition. For the full, authoritative article, please see the December *Telegraph* available through the NRHS.

"By now, NRHS members in good standing have received their notices that their dues for 2015 are payable to NRHS. Unlike recent years, for 2015, NRHS is collecting the National dues directly from our membership. We are encouraging everyone to renew as soon as possible, and to use the online option with a credit card instead of sending paper checks to Fernley & Fernley. When the member uses the credit card option, we avoid paying Fernley & Fernley a processing charge for each paper check that they have to manually handle and deposit. The online option leaves more of the dues revenue available to NRHS and its programs rather than paying for additional outside administrative support... NRHS Vice President Joe Maloney will periodically pull dues receipt data down from the chapters' records in the NRHS membership database, and provide the individual chapters with Excel spreadsheets showing which of their members have paid their NRHS dues, and remain in good standing through December 31, 2015. This process will be unique to the 2015 dues campaign, and will not be repeated next year."

#### Railroad Lore and Trivia

The Railroad Safety Appliance Act of 1893 required a uniform system for couplers and brakes on trains. The law did reduce the number of employee accidents, but did little for passenger service. Many railroads continued to use the old brake and coupler systems well into the twentieth century.

The then-new Interstate Commerce Commission embarked on a major series of valuations in order to establish the real worth of the nation's railroads. Contrary to public belief, railroad stocks turned out not to be "watered," or artificially inflated.

Steam engines produced an enormous amount of heat in the normal course of operation. In order to protect the crew, railroads extensively employed the miracle fibers, asbestos. It would be decades before the implications of that decision became clear.

"Screaming Jenny" is a famous ghost of Harpers Ferry. She was living in a small house by the tracks when a spark from the stove lit her dress on fire. She burst from her home in flames, screaming for help. She stumbled into the path of a B&O train and was killed. For decades, trains have slammed on their brakes to avoid hitting a flaming, screaming woman who vanishes as quickly as she appears.

Air Brakes were an important safety innovation, allowing a train to stop much more quickly and smoothly. Even then, using the airbrakes was known as "shaking the train."

The four railroads found on a standard Monopoly board are: the Pennsylvania, the Reading, the Short Line, and the B&O.

The Denver & Rio Grande No. 107 is remembered as a cursed engine. It first lost two crew in a bridge washout. After another two crew and some passengers were killed in an accident, she was known as "Dread 107." Another accident claimed four more crewmen, and someone carved the names of the dead into her cab. Years later, two brothers went insane and killed themselves in the engine. Then the engine went runaway, killing its five-man crew. After that, crews refused to work on it and it was scrapped.

Originally, the lights on either side of the headlight were called Blizzard Lights that served in an emergency when the oil-burning headlight blew out. Now they indicate the train is non-scheduled or extra.

Telescoping is a colloquial term used to describe the act of one railroad coach violently plunging itself into another coach during a train wreck. It was more common and dangerous when coaches were constructed of wooden materials.

### Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, December 2, 2014 NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: December 2, 2014, M&O Station Grill, Fort Worth..

The December meeting and annual Christmas party was held at the M & O Station Grill in Ft. Worth.. The M & O Station Grill was named after the M & O Subway built by Marvin and Obie Leonard, two Ft. Worth brothers who owned & operated Leonard's Department Store in Ft. Worth. In 1963, when parking in the downtown area around their store became problematic, the brothers came up with the idea of building a private





subway system from the store basement to a remote parking lot on the north side of town. The subway was over a quarter mile long and ran up to 41 ft. below street level. It continued to operate until 2005 when downtown renovation work closed to subway down. The tunnel and parking lot still exist and a renovated subway car is on display at One City Place, 300 Throckmorton Street in downtown Ft. Worth, Texas.

President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order after the 20 or so attending members and guests had eaten dinner.

VP Trips & Events and National Director Skip Waters reported that the National dues statements had been mailed and would be arriving later this week. Treasurer Jim King has already sent chapter renewal notices to members, so only National dues should be sent to National. Members may pay online at NRHS.COM. Please pay your Chapter & National dues promptly, especially if running for chapter office or planning on voting for the candidates.

Treasurer Jim King reported that the chapter book sales had reached 82 books sold so far. Members in attendance were given the opportunity to purchase a copy tonight for \$5 off and several took advantage to purchase their copy now. The book is due for release in late December.

Skip showed a picture he found of the named train, The Sunbeam, from the tail end showing the drumhead in backlit mode vs. the later neon version. The picture validates his contention that the representative drumhead on display at Dallas Union Station is incorrect.

Skip also announced that chapter member and newsletter editor Valli Hoski has accepted the additional duties as editor of the 'Telegraph'. Be ready for deadlines.

While inspecting the numerous photos in the museum, it was discovered that recently deceased member Russ Covitt's father, Ned Covitt was Leonard's Interior Display designer responsible for designing the Toyland Express monorail train that carried over 100,000 passengers yearly over the heads of customers in the toy department.


