President's Roundhouse: 24 Hours at Saginaw

Alas, another "24 Hours at Saginaw" has come and gone, the 11th annual event as a matter of fact! It's still as fun as the first one and the list of new friends keeps growing. Many thanks to all of our participants, presenters, sponsors (Saginaw Area Chamber of Commerce and BNSF Railway) and chapter members for continuing the tradition of "24 Hours at Saginaw" as consistently being one of the top rail events and train watching spots in the Midwest. Due to rain, many trains were delayed down south and our number of participants was lower than usual. If you have never been to our event, the died-hard ferroequinologists show up no matter what. Many participants sleep in tents along tent row or sleep in their cars so that they can remain for the 24 hour period. Some never sleep at all. The grounds were muddy and soggy this year, but the true rail buffs showed up anyway. Even though our numbers were down slightly, it was exciting and refreshing to see more teenagers than ever before show interest by attending, participating, presenting, filming and shooting trains. We had participants from all over the great state of Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma and as far away as Oregon, Utah and Florida. We had 95 registered attendees and many more that did not register. We recorded a low of 33 trains this year when we average 50-55 trains per event.

Of course, none of this would happen without the hard work of Skip Waters, Vice President of Trips and Events for the North Texas Chapter of the NRHS. Also, thanks to members Jerry Nunn, Bob Kennedy, Dave Gramm and Tom Cox for their hard work in supporting Skip and this event. This year, we raised \$275.00 that will be used toward our Heritage Grant Program.

Former Texas Electric #314 "Freight Motor" to be Restored by BSVRR

Steve Siegerist suggested this article as "there is a Texas connection in this".

"The Iowa Railroad Historical Society (IRHS) has acquired freight motor #53 from the Iowa Traction Railway (IATR) in Mason City. This acquisition comes thanks to a generous donation from IRHS board member Wayne Paterson. Motor #53 will be moved by tractor trailer from the IATR in Mason City to the Boone & Scenic Valley Railroad (BSVRR) in Boone this Saturday. The restoration of #53 will begin soon. Once the restoration is complete, #53 will be placed into service alongside Charles City Western interurban car #50 at the BSVRR.

Freight motor #53 was built by the St. Louis Car Co. in 1913 (order 990) for the Southern Traction as #314. She started life as a passenger car. In 1917, Texas Electric Ry. purchased the Southern Traction, and she became Texas Electric #314. In 1928 she was rebuilt into a Class A "Freight Motor" along with "sisters" #800 & #802, and became #801. She ran on the Texas Electric Ry. was disbanded."

Recall the beauty of the Texas Zephyr, Texas Eagle and the Sam Houston Zephyr as they meandered through the countryside. Learn about the passenger trains that once served the Metroplex and North Central Texas in the days before Amtrak from train historian Steve Goen at 2:00 pm, Saturday, June 11 at the Allen Public Library. After the program, local historian Tom Keener will offer a guided tour of Allen's stone dam, which is Allen's only structure designated as a State Archaeological Landmark. Sponsored by the Allen Public Library and North Texas Chapter, NRHS, this program is free. The library is located at 300 N. Allen Dr. Call 214-509-4911.

Steve Goen commented on the excitement surrounding these passenger trains, "Whenever you visited Dallas Union Terminal... there was always something to see. Every morning all the trains would start arriving from all over the southwest... Denver, Kansas City, El Paso, Minneapolis and even Tulsa."



Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, May 3, 2016

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: May 3, 2016. Garland Landmark Museum, Landmark Depot Crossing 393 N. Sixth Street Garland TX 75040.

The monthly meeting was held at the Garland Landmark Museum in Garland, Texas and hosted by museum docent and chapter member Claude Doane. The meeting was called to order by President Wayne Smith at 7:57pm, with 9 members present. Wayne welcomed everyone in attendance and thanked Claude for the use of the facility.

VP-Trips & Events and National Director Skip Waters reported on our upcoming event, '24 Hours @ Saginaw'. Everything is a 'go' at this time. The annual insurance policy has been renewed. We have a great program scheduled but Skip says he could always use a few more presenters. A potential problem recently occurred. A new young railfan who has been noted on Facebook and several rail groups went to the Saginaw depot recently and was accosted by the BNSF police for trespassing. According to one account, the police were quoted as saying the house track at the depot is BNSF property. We have marked off the house track as inside the safe zone in previous years. Skip is working with the BNSF to determine the actual property lines at the depot so that we can correctly mark off the safe zone for this year without incurring their wrath.

Skip reported on attending the NRHS board meeting last month which was quiet. He has been nominated to run for the District 7 position uncontested and William Brotherton has been nominated to be a global director candidate. Our newsletter editor Valli Hoski represented our chapter at the advisory council meeting and gave generally positive comments.

National wants to amend the By-laws again for three changes:

1) Define what a chapter is. Members must be 100% national members for group to be considered a chapter.

2) Reduce the board of directors from 25 to 7 with all directors to be global directors. No more district directors.

3) The president and VP either elected by the board or by the membership. Secretary and Treasurer need not be board members.





National is starting to appreciate the cost of paper mail. Sending the Bulletins & News by email now with a debate ongoing on how to deal with cost increases for printing/mailing. Skip reported we are in the black now and have been able to give grant monies to various groups this past year. Membership is just under 6000. We lost the Cotton Belt chapter in Arkansas and are losing a chapter every other board meeting or so. We need to define our mission statement. Exploring offering corporate non-profit affiliate membership for groups like the Galveston Museum for some multiple of the single rate and looking at suggestions on how to handle for-profit corporate affiliations with separate rates.

Regarding this year's upcoming convention, Skip reported the Royal Gorge dome car trips are sold out. There are still a few non-dome car seats available. The light rail trip is also close to sell out. He predicted this year's convention to be in the black vs losses incurred in previous years. The 2017 convention will be is Nashville and the board is currently looking for host chapters for the spring and fall conferences.

Skip reported on receiving a response from the GE plant in Ft. Worth. The plant tour personnel do not do tours in the evenings or on weekends, only Tuesdays or Thursdays from 9-11am. Skip polled the members and is going back to set up a tour during those parameters and will report back on progress.

VP-Programs Jon Shea reported the June meeting will be at SOKOL Hall in Dallas, TX. Member Pat Coughlin is lined up to give a program. July's meeting should be at the Founder's Building in Grapevine but Jon hadn't heard back from the city reservations clerk yet. Jon visited Galveston over the weekend and visited an antique mall on the Strand. While there he purchased some railroadianna for his collection and brought it to share. He showed off an IC matchbook, a Pullman Diamond Jubilee commemoration booklet, and a Texas Chief timetable.

Program for the evening was a presentation by member Jerry Nunn on the latest motive power and graffiti photos he had taken in the Ft. Worth area.

As a reminder from last month, on June 11 at 2pm, the Allen Public Library will host a presentation of Steve Goens' newest book. Our chapter will co-sponsor the event with the library and members are encouraged to attend to show our support.
