NRHS Election - Nominations Deadline is March 31, 2018

This year the President and one director from each of the nine districts (1-7 plus A and B) and two Global Director seats are up for election. Some of the incumbents have decided not to seek reelection, specifically District 3 Director Frank Fowler, District 4 Director Sam Williamson, and District 7 Director Steven Siegerist. The Global Director seat formerly held by the late David Flinn will be temporarily filled by an appointment of the NRHS Board at the 2018 Spring Conference. That seat is up for election this year.

The nomination period to run for office will expire on March 31, 2018. All members are asked to advise the Election Committee if they wish to seek election to any of the districts (not only those which have no candidate) or for the President prior to that time.

The Board needs candidates who have the time to work on the many issues facing the Society and to attend meetings (held about three times a year) to work with management. **Please consider running and joining the board**. Chapter Business Meeting Minutes, March 2018.

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: March 6, 2018.

The meeting was held on Thursday, March 6, 2018 in the Texas Northern Model RR Club facility at the Collin Creek Mall in Plano, TX. The meeting was delayed for two days to accommodate a visit to the model RR club's layout, and to attend a presentation on the Texas Central High Speed Rail project. Twenty were in attendance: nine North Texas Chapter members, and 11 Texas Northern members or visitors.

President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 6:38 PM. Start time was moved up an hour to provide time for those interested to visit the Texas Northern layout.

Secretary Jerry Nunn noted that the bus substitute for the Amtrak Texas Eagles was still on schedule to terminate on March 11.

VP Special Events Skip Waters provided updates on this year's NRHS National Convention, scheduled to take place in Cumberland, MD. Reservations for NRHS members have been secured at the Ramada Inn in Cumberland, MD for a \$72

nightly rate, valid August 8-12. Members planning to attend should contact the Ramada Inn in Cumberland for reservations, and provide the code word "LOCOMOTIVE". Several events have been scheduled as part of the convention. Refer to the NRHS website (NRHS.com) for details.

The saga of steam engine 503 continues. The engine has now returned to the ownership of the City of Port Arthur, TX, with no plans to scrap the vintage locomotive. The NRHS meeting adjourned at 7:04 PM.

The Texas Central presentation immediately followed the adjournment.

Rebecca Cowle gave an extremely interesting presentation about the Texas Central Partners High Speed Rail Project. There were at least 11 important points to take away from the program:

- This is a PRIVATELY funded project; thus, no government funds will be used:
- Construction is scheduled to begin in 2019, and be completed in 2024;
- Construction will generate about 10,000 jobs, and after construction is completed, the railroad will provide about 1500 high paying jobs;
- The trains, powered by electric locomotives and designed by Japan Railways, will operate on a grade separated right of way that makes extensive use of existing utility easements;
- The trains will use their version of Automatic Train Control, which meets or exceeds the FRA standards for Positive Train Control;
- The line will be double tracked, with dedicated northbound and southbound tracks; except at the seven planned intermediate maintenance facilities, no crossovers are planned;
- Trains are projected to depart the terminals every 30 minutes, with an 80 or 90 minute trip (depending on whether the train makes an intermediate stop);
- Three stations are planned: the northern terminus will be in the Cedars area of Dallas, just south of the Central Business District; the southern terminus will be in Houston near the Northwest Mall; and an intermediate station will be located in the Brazos Valley;
- The trains will consist of 8 permanently coupled cars, with locomotives at each end; There will be 400 seats in each train, arranged in a 2X2 configuration, with a middle aisle;
- Plans call for an initial deployment of 15 trainsets, with the capability to add more trainsets if needed;
- Ticket prices will follow the airlines pricing models, and they will be competitive with the airline fares;

At the conclusion of the presentation, some attendees toured the Texas Northern facilities and the model RR layout. Jerry M. Nunn, Secretary, North Texas Chapter, NRHS
