



Station Scene along the Way – St. Ignace, Michigan

The Mackinac Transportation Company (MTC) was a joint venture founded in 1881 by three separate railroads, the <u>Detroit, Mackinac</u> and <u>Marquette Railroad</u>, the <u>Grand Rapids and Indiana Railroad</u>, and the <u>Michigan Central</u>. For twelve-month service, the railroads connected their three railheads located in <u>Mackinaw City, Michigan</u> and <u>St. Ignace, Michigan</u>.

The MTC purchased various rail ferries, starting with the SS Algomah. However, the Algomah was too light to break ice effectively. The St. Ignace was built with a propeller at her bow to break ice ahead of the hull, and entered service in April 1888. In October 1911, the company's largest and first steel-hulled vessel, the 26-railcar <u>SS Chief</u> <u>Wawatam</u>, entered service.

In 1916, MTC began carrying automobile traffic, with vehicles loaded onto railcars for the passage. Limited capacity and high rates led to public dissatisfaction that culminated in 1923 in the introduction of state-run car ferries across the strait. Rail passenger traffic declined, and eventually ended in August 1955 when the last passenger train departed Mackinaw City. Chief Wawatam continued to operate until August 1984, when a wall collapsed at the St. Ignace dock, making it unusable.^[7] The ship was laid up awaiting a decision from the state regarding the future of the service, until in 1986 the Soo Line Railroad abandoned the unused railroad to the St. Ignace docks—shortly thereafter the tracks to the Mackinaw City were also removed and Chief Wawatam was sold in 1988 for conversion into a barge.



Trinity Metro & TEXRail Roll Out More Service with Spike!

As announced by Trinity Metro, TEXRail, the new commuter rail line in Tarrant County, will extend from downtown Fort Worth, northeast through North Richland Hills to downtown Grapevine, and then into DFW International Airport. The commuter route will have a corridor length of approximately 27 miles and provide direct access to all activity centers operating on the following existing tracks: Fort Worth & Western, Burlington Northern Santa Fe, Union Pacific railroads, and the former Cotton Belt route now owned by DART. Nine stations will include ticket vending, covered seating, lighting, security cameras. The anticipated addition of the 'Spike' locomotive equipment in 2019 will enable additional service for the line.



Spike's blog: All about TEXRail's newest train

My name is Spike, and I'm the latest addition to the TEXRail family. You might have heard about my participation in the grand opening for the Stadler U.S. plant in Salt Lake City. I was proud to represent Trinity Metro and to showcase the sleek TEXRail design while celebrating Stadler's success – and the 150th anniversary of the Golden Spike. That's when the ceremonial golden spike was driven to join the rails of the first Transcontinental Railroad on May 10, 1869. For those of you who have already ridden TEXRail, you know that the TEXRail fleet is unlike any other in the United States. The Swiss design makes for a smooth, comfortable ride in a bidirectional train. That's definitely a different look for trains in Texas.



During the planning phase, Trinity Metro made some modifications to the original design to make sure I'd feel right at home in the Lone Star State. People in the Metroplex like to ride their bikes. But snow ski in Texas? Not so much. That meant replacing the ski racks with vertical bike racks. Another good idea was to be egalitarian with one class of transport for everyone. So they replaced the first class car with a quiet car, giving riders a chance to relax and unplug. If you haven't tried TEXRail yet, I hope you will soon. I'm going to hang out in Utah just a bit longer, and then I'll be headed to Texas. Can't wait to meet y'all!





DART and Dallas Keep Streetcar Roles on Track

The Dallas Area Rapid Transit (DART) Board agreed at their July meeting to implement a Master Streetcar Interlocal Agreement between DART and the City of Dallas that establishes Dallas Streetcar roles and responsibilities. The agreement is needed to consolidate existing contracts and to outline responsibilities related to the planning, design, construction, procurement, operations and maintenance of the Dallas Streetcar, now and in the future.

Project Specific Amendments would be presented to the DART Board for approval related to scope, schedule and funding sources for studies or projects that would become part of the streetcar system. The agreement's approval now goes to the Dallas City Council for approval later this summer. The City's responsibilities, as the streetcar owner, will include project scope, planning funding, grant management, design and construction funding, utility relocations, operations and maintenance, and streetcar vehicle funding. Chapter Meeting Minutes, August 6, 2019

NORTH TEXAS CHAPTER, NATIONAL RAILWAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY, MINUTES, DATE: August 6, 2019.

The August 2019 meeting of the North Texas Chapter of the NRHS was held on Tuesday, August 6 at Sokol Hall in Dallas, Texas. There were eleven attendees.

Chapter President Wayne Smith called the meeting to order at 7:45 PM. He recognized Harry and VP Communications Valli and her husband Harry, who were in town and able to attend.

DISCUSSION:

President Wayne Smith:

- Would like for the Chapter to take a field trip to the Burlington-Rock Island museum (B-RI) in Teague, TX to make donations. Volunteers would be needed; planning will take some time (a few months).
- The Chapter should offer to assist Sam Walls of the Cleburne Railroad Museum in developing a plaque to acknowledge the 100-year old Santa Fe locomotive No. 3417. A formal presentation is scheduled in Cleburne, TX on Saturday, October 19 from 2:00 PM – 4:00 PM, and the Chapter should have a presence.
- Chapter member Bill Frantz has been with the Chapter for 25 years. The Chapter should present Bill a certificate and 25year pin, perhaps at the Christmas banquet.

Treasurer Bob Kennedy:

• Provided a copy of the Treasurer's report for the Secretary's files. The Chapter is solvent, and is expected to remain so.





Dave Podhrasky:

- The Fall Plano Train Show will be a one day event, Saturday, October 12. The Chapter will have only one table to sell books and provide handouts. Bob Kennedy will order membership forms for the train show.
- There is the need for volunteers to man the tickets booths and other tasks. A sign up sheet is available; check with one of the officers.
- There will be no slide show Saturday evening.

NATIONAL BOARD MEETING:

VP Skip Waters:

- Planning continues for the November National Board meeting. For those who wish to drive to the hotel, parking is free.
- The number of volunteers is being evaluated. As the planning moves forward, the number will be adjusted as required. In the meantime, the Chapter Secretary should draft a paragraph encouraging members from the North Texas Chapter to volunteer to help out in the meeting. [Editor's note: see Volunteer Call notice in September issue.]
- Although not yet done, there will be maps available to participants in the rail tour on Friday, November 8.
- To test how the train schedules may impact the logistics of the r rail tour, VP Skip Waters, Treasurer Bob Kennedy, and Secretary Jerry Nunn will make a dry run of all the rail excursions on Friday, August 16. The findings and recommendations will be discussed at the next Chapter Board meeting.

Secretary Jerry Nunn:

- Jerry has discussed the possibility of getting paper Amtrak conductor hats (for attendee handouts) with the lead ticket agent at the Ft. Worth station. He will ask for 50 hats, and see if he can get that number.
- Jerry will be able to purchase tickets for the planned rail excursion. A single all day regional pass can be purchased in advance at the manned Trinity Metro kiosk located at the Ft. Worth Central Station (aka the Intermodal Transit Center – ITC). Cost is \$12 per pass and is non-refundable.

VP Jon Shea:

- The September meeting of the Chapter will be held on Tuesday, September 10 at the Spring Creek BBQ in Grapevine, beginning 7 PM. The meeting has been delayed for one week to avoid conflicting with the Labor Day holiday.
- The October meeting will take place at the Texas Western Model RR Club in Forest Hill, TX.
- The December meeting will be the annual Christmas banquet at the Babe's Chicken Dinner House in Frisco, TX.

2020 National Convention:

- The convention is scheduled for Fullterton, California. The hotel is in the Knotts Berry Farm. There is a discount rate, and guests will get a discount at the Knotts Berry Farm.
- Several tours, including the Orange County Museum, are planned. Details will be available on the National NRHS website as they come available.

The evening's program was a DVD of the Golden Spike Ceremony. The meeting adjourned following the conclusion of the program. Jerry M. Nunn, Secretary, North Texas Chapter NRHS.

Friday, November 8

(Part A) Morning group tour of the DFW Transit/Commuter rail lines to include, DART, Trinity Railway Express, TEXRail, Dallas Streetcar. Lunch is OYO (on your own) in the historic Bishop Arts District via the Dallas Streetcar. Afterwards, you will have 3 choices to enjoy your afternoon.
