## **3)** January Meeting Minutes

The January 2022 monthly meeting of the North Texas Chapter of the National Railway Historical Society was held on Tuesday the 4<sup>th</sup> at Sokol Hall in Dallas. The business meeting was called to order at 7:39 PM by Chapter President Wayne Smith with 13 members in attendance. Wayne wished everybody a Happy New Year and

encouraged everybody to pay their chapter dues for 2022. Chapter Treasurer Bob Kennedy was in attendance and was happy to accept the membership dues. Bob also shared the following: Chapter Membership dues are paid directly to the North Texas Chapter. National NRHS Membership dues are paid directly to National and are in addition to your North Texas Chapter Membership dues. You should have already received a National Membership renewal notice and payment information separately from the National NRHS. Do not send your National NRHS Membership dues payment to the North Texas Chapter.

Wayne announced that the Dallas Area Train Show in Plano, TX is coming up on January 15-16 and there were two volunteer slots that needed to be filled on Sunday, January 16<sup>th</sup>. Chapter Members and Show Organizers Dave Gramm and Dave P. joined the conversation and shared additional details about the show.

Wayne also announced the Grand Re-Opening of the Cleburne Railroad Museum, January 13-15, 2022. Some chapter members were planning to attend.

# The program for the evening was our annual Show and Tell and included the following member presentations.

Bill Long showed the book, Classic Railroad Scenes", that he got for Christmas. The book contained a photo of Dallas Railway & Terminal No. 190 parked at the DR & T Depot in Dallas. Bill also shared a snapshot of himself at a Five Rings Milwaukee yard shanty when he was employed by the Milwaukee Road in the 70's. There was also a yard map.

Bob Kennedy shared a Penn Central "swift moving" Metroliner promotional paper weight and a "Metroliner, The Smarter Shuttle" key chain. Bob also shared an Amtrak "Trainman" Hat Badge and a Long Island Railroad "Conductor" Hat Badge.
